

**Premier Turf Club presents our guest handicappers:** Guest handicapper Derby1592, Chris Larmey is not only a close friend, but someone I consider one helluva horse player. It is my opinion that he might be the best grass handicapper in the country. Chris has qualified for the NHC each of the last 3 years, and I'm confident with a little luck he will win it at some point. We've also got a couple of races from one of our partners, and a slate of plays from another great handicapper, Yavapai track announcer "Boomer" Wry, So without further adieu...

Hello, this is Chris Larmey. This week we will do something a little bit different. Below we've listed some live long shots from the top notch Belmont Stakes day card that can be used in Pick-4s and/or other exotics. Good luck and enjoy some great racing at Belmont!

**Bel 4th race (1:52 EST): #7-Conduct of Honor** (20/1 morning line) ran well in his debut despite a troubled trip and now comes back against a relatively weak allowance field. He could improve off that race and is good value at the morning line.

**Bel 5th race (2:30 EST): #2-Daytime Promise** (20/1 morning line) has never been on the turf, but is well bred for it and sports a decent turf workout. She seldom runs a bad one, hitting the board in her last 8 starts (all but one a stakes races) and looks like she may be on the improve. She should get a good trip and could pull the upset if she does take to the grass.

**Bel 7th race (3:46 EST): #3-Miss Shop** (15/1 morning line) is as fast as anyone in the race and still has some upside. While she disliked the yielding turf last out and does run the occasional clunker, she always runs well at Belmont and is 1 for 1 on the Bel turf. She sports a hot trainer and a good rider, and anything near the 15/1 ML is a gift, assuming the going is firm.

**Bel 9th race (5:04 EST): #2-Princess Janie** (12/1 morning line) stretches out and the distance is a question, but if she can avoid an early duel with the favorite, she has a shot to upset at a price.

**Bel 10th race (5:44 EST): #9-Kiss the Kid** (20/1 morning line) has already flashed some talent and still has some upside. On occasion he's tended to go a bit too fast early, so they freshened him up, took the blinkers off and stretch him out to 10f in the hopes that he will relax. He is certainly bred to like the added distance, sports some sizzling recent drills without the hood and should be able work a nice tracking trip behind likely pacesetter, **Red Zipper**. I think he'll take to the longer distances and, if he is fit off the break and can avoid an early duel, he could pull the upset at a big price.

**Bel 11th race (6:25 EST): #4-C P West** (12/1 morning line) ran a huge race last out in the Preakness pressing a hot pace 3-wide and making a nice middle move before hanging late. He might be tighter now given that the Preakness was his first two-turn race of the year, has some good distance breeding underneath, and a trainer who is always dangerous in the Belmont. The pace should be much softer this time and if the top two from the Preakness don't fire, then he could pull the upset.

**Bel 13th race (7:40 EST): #8-You Sure** (20/1 morning line) was legged up in a sprint prep on the turf in his first 3yo start. He now stretches out in his second turf try, is bred to run long on the grass and should be ready to run a big race. If none of the AE's draw into the race (there are several strong contenders in the AE's), he is as likely to win as any other in here. The big negative is the apprentice rider who only has a handful of wins on his resume, but that should help ensure a big price.

**Canterbury Park Race 4 (7:18 EST)** is another renewal of the 45K Brooks Fields stakes for older runners going 7.5F on the CBY sod. This year's test is a rematch between last year's winner and runner-up, **Load A Chronic** and **Dontbotherknocking**. 'Chronic comes into this race fresh, off a strong work tab, and the guess is he's ready to roll right off the bench. A bargain at anywhere near the ML price. We're going to take a stand against 'Knocking in his 2<sup>nd</sup> start at the ripe old age of 9. Sure he had a no win trip last time behind a 24 second opening quarter, but he was just plugging on late, running the slowest 3<sup>rd</sup> fraction in his last 10 starts. He'll probably be 9/5 – 2/1 at post time, which is a tough price to take on a horse that may have lost a step. Favorite **Prospective Kiss** (coming out of the same slow paced race as 'Knocking) is also an underlay at the 3-1 ML. If you HAVE to play the exotics, **Slick Carson** is a stretch in the win hole but might be on the lead coming out of some fast paced sprints, and **Vazandar** could get a share underneath, stretching out in 3<sup>rd</sup> off a layoff. **Mountaineer Race 9 (10:20 EST)** is the Slipton Fell Handicap (nice play on words) a 1M 70 yard contest on the main oval. The value here is in tossing ML favorite **Tap Dancing Mauk** from all the exotics. At the weights, he's about the slowest in here, and there is nothing in his line that says he can be expected to run any faster. The long shot key in this race is **Smalltown Slew**. While his last two were just so/so, his winter form puts him right here with these, and Flint hits at a 25% rate with stakes horses at MNR over the past 3 seasons (\$1.97 ROI). **Ryan's For Real** is a legitimate short price in here coming off a disappointing 3<sup>rd</sup> on Preakness Day. We think he towers over these if 'Slew doesn't run to his back numbers. R. Earl is another live shot that's likely to be overlooked based upon his company lines. He comes from a small time barn that runs 'em when their ready to fire, returning a \$2.50 ROI over the past year. **Mr. Pursuit** (not all that fast though moving to a better barn) and **Bernie Blue** (fast but awful energy distribution for a route even if he is lone speed) are both underlays here.
